Introduction and Background of the institution

The Shikshan Prasarak Sanstha was established in 1961 with a mission to make higher education available to students from rural backgrounds like Sangamner and its vicinity. Since its inception, the college has been following its vision "Spread knowledge unto the last" by taking the educational needs of the rural masses into account. In the year 2020, the college was conferred autonomous status by University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

In imparting higher education to its students, the college has always taken care that its efforts remain focused on the upliftment of socio-economically and culturally deprived rural youth of Sangamner and its vicinity. Presently, around 6000 students are pursuing their higher education indifferent streams on a huge lush green and eco-friendly campus of 50 acres.

Being motivated by the dictum "Think globally, act locally", we have made it our guiding principle. Though we act locally, we aspire to think globally. We not only endeavour to impart the basics of education by offering traditional education but we also take special efforts to empower aspiring youth academically by offering vocational courses in Computer Applications to the students of Arts & Commerce. The courses like B.B.A., B.B.A (CA), and B.C.A. were started with the same purpose.

The college is known for executing innovative programmes such as restructuring of the courses at the undergraduate level and innumerable skill-based and job-oriented activities. The college runs several skills-based courses supported by University Grants Commission (9 BVoc and 2 M.Voc courses) and Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY).

11 Ph.D. Research Centres (Marathi, Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Economics, Politics, Commerce, Chemistry, Physics, Botany and Zoology) keep upgrading the research culture among the students.

Curriculum Design and Development

- 1. The college currently offers 32 U.G., 18 P.G., 2 Certificate, 3 Diploma, 9 M. Phil and 10 Ph.D. programmes in 3 disciplines. Faculty Profile and Quality

3. Qualified and competent teachers are appointed as per the sanctioned numbers at our college. During the academic year 2023-24, 166 full-time teachers were on roll, out of which 65 have Ph.D. to their credit.

Mentoring

- A mechanism for assessing the learning levels of the students is in place. The slow learners are
 identified as those who score less than the average marks of the class. The advanced learners are
 identified based on the benchmarks set by the subject teacher. Assistance is offered to the slow
 learners in the form of assignments, bridge courses and counselling. The advanced learners are
 encouraged through the student research scheme, internships, Vidya Dhan Kalash Yojana and
 awards.
- 2. 115 mentors have been assigned to the mentee. A record of mentor-mentee interactions and counselling is kept in the form of a counselling book.

Participative Teaching and Learning

The College creates a conducive environment for teaching and learning through learner-centric
methods such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methods using
ICT tools as needed.

Student-centric methods adopted towards Experiential and Participative Learning Experience:

- Experiential Learning:
 - i. Workshops: Workshops for students are routinely arranged to provide hands-on training.
 - ii. Internships/On-the-job training: Several students, especially of B. Voc. programmes, commerce and computer science, go for internships and on-the-job trainings.



iii. Study Tours and Field visits: Almost all departments take their students for field visits/ study tours. Department of Geography organises its practicals in nearby villages. Department of Botany, Zoology, Physics, Chemistry, and Electronics, etc., takes their students for excursions.

Participative learning:

- i. Socio-economic surveys: The Department of Economics organises socioeconomic surveys.
- Mock Parliament: Department of Political Science promotes the students to participate in the Mock Parliament.
- iii. Group discussions: Many students participate in Group discussions under the evaluation methods of the choice-based credit system. Problem-solving methodologies: Students are encouraged to take part in the Student Research scheme to develop the ability of analysis and problem-solving. Even during the pandemic, the students used primary data to carry out student research.

Problem Solving Methods:

- Students undertake Project Work on problems related to their subject domain, supported by teacher guides.
- ii. The students present the findings of their projects in Prin. M. V. Kaundiya Research Competition and Avishkar Research Convention.
- iii. Group Discussions are organised to promote problem-solving and the quest for generating new solutions.
- iv. Case studies are used as effective tools to promote problem-solving abilities.

Use of ICT in Teaching and Learning

- LMS: The teachers make use of ICT for effective teaching with Learning the teachers of the college
 have made use of various Learning Management Systems viz. Moodle, Google Classroom, Canvas.
 The evaluation of the students has been carried out through Google Forms, Moodle, Canvas, and
 TestMoz.
- 2. Smart boards: To make teaching more effective, seminar halls, some classrooms and departments have the provision of smart boards. Whiteboards (Zoom) and Jamboard (Google Meet) have been used effectively.  - Department of Computer Science, BBA, BBA (CA), Physics, B.Voc (SD) and Library have computer labs and browsing centres. All departments have computers in departmental libraries.
 - The college has a Botanical garden with a rich diversity of flora. It is utilised for botanical studies by the Department of Botany.
 - A spacious Yoga Hall is available for Yoga activities.
- 2. The institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, Yoga, Sports, and games as described below:
