In the year 2020, the college was conferred autonomous status by University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

In imparting higher education to its students, the college has always taken care that its efforts remain focused on the upliftment of socio-economically and culturally deprived rural youth of Sangamner and its vicinity. Presently, around 6000 students are pursuing their higher education indifferent streams on a huge lush green and eco-friendly campus of 50 acres.

Being motivated by the dictum "Think globally, act locally", we have made it our guiding principle. Though we act locally, we aspire to think globally. We not only endeavour to impart the basics of education by offering traditional education but we also take special efforts to empower aspiring youth academically by offering vocational courses in Computer Applications to the students of Arts & Commerce. Qualified and competent teachers are appointed as per the sanctioned numbers at our college.
 During the academic year 2024-25, 164 full-time teachers were on roll, out of which 64 have
 Ph.D. to their credit.

Mentoring

- There is a system in place to evaluate the students' learning levels. Those who receive belowaverage grades in the class are considered slow learners. The criteria established by the subject teacher are used to identify the advanced students. Slow learners receive help through counselling, bridging courses, and assignments.  institution runs in two shifts. Therefore, an adequate number of classrooms are always available. All
 the classrooms are equipped with Wi-Fi connectivity and are LAN enabled. They have facilities like
 LCD projectors and Smart boards.
 - 32 laboratories covering a total area of 25808.80 sq. ft. There are 10 computer laboratories covering an area of 5094.03 sq.ft. are available to offer computing facilities for the Department of Computer Science, BBA/BBA (CA), Physics, Mathematics, and Geography.
 - Department of Computer Science, BBA, BBA (CA), Physics, B.Voc (SD) and Library have computer labs and browsing centers. All departments have computers in departmental libraries.
 - The college has a Botanical garden with a rich diversity of flora. It is utilized for the botanical studies by Department of Botany.
 - A spacious Yoga Hall is available for Yoga activities.
- 2. The institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, Yoga, Sports, and games as described below:
 - Cultural Activities: For cultural activities, the college has Saibaba Auditorium, Saibaba Open Theatre and Gandhi Mandela Open Theatre.



Yoga and Health: For yoga, a spacious Yoga Hall is available, Tagore Ashram is available for meditation. Madhavlal Malpani Yoga and naturopathy centre includes, Yoga therapy centers, seminar halls, yoga halls, and classrooms.

Sports and Games: The college has a huge playground with 8 lane track for athletics. The ground is utilized for games such as net balls, hockey, cricket, kabaddi and long jump. A basket ball ground is available. The indoor facilities include 16 station multi gym, Boxing ring, Table tennis, and Badminton court.

- Construction of 52,000 square feet has been completed at Kaushal Bhavan, which comprises five floors. Separate departments for Examination, Zoology, Hospitality and Tourism and Software Development have been fully constructed and furnished.
- 4. Additionally, construction of 21,000 square feet has been completed at Gymkhana building. This includes office space, a table tennis hall, an advanced Audio-visual room, a conference room, a yoga hall and a multipurpose auditorium featuring four badminton courts.

- Social engagement beyond the programmes driven by the government needs to be encouraged, along with consultancy in more areas.
- 8. Job fairs should be organised.
- 9. Alumni engagement needs to be increased.
